Our Benevolences and Volunteers at work **Locally**

In Farmington/Farmington Hills:

- **Adopt a Family** - We support several families for the Christmas holiday providing much more than the required one new toy and one new outfit for each child in the family as well as a special Christmas dinner for the family.
- **Farmington/Farmington Hills Foundation for Youth and Families** – Provides financial support as well as backpacks for kids filled with food for the entire family for the weekend.
- **Farmington/Farmington Hills Meals on Wheels** – Operates out of the Costick Center serving meals to the elderly, infirm and others in their homes.
- **Farmington Area Support Team (FAST)** – Works to create a resource network for the Farmington Public Schools staff to use in meeting the needs of its homeless students and their families.
- **Farmington YMCA** – Provides financial assistance for summer camp, sports and wellness programs for all ages, and social interaction for seniors.
- **Minister's Discretionary Fund** – Provides financial assistance for special and confidential needs for church members and people of the community.
- **Multi-Cultural and Multi-Racial Community Council of Farmington and Farmington Hills** - Works to assure that all residents of our communities enjoy an harmonious, healthy environment and that they feel welcome and comfortable in their cities, schools, and neighborhoods. The Council is dedicated to promoting community awareness and acceptance of diversity among its citizens.
- **Neighborhood House** – Assists clients by connecting them to available aid.
- **C.A.R.E.S Food Cupboard** – Collects donations of food and paper goods available for anyone who knocks on their door.
- **Source of Universal Love (SOUL)** – Provides food, clothing, education, resource research, household goods, furniture, care counseling, transportation, comfort and compassion to enable clients to return to self-sustaining status.

In Metropolitan Detroit:

- **Capuchin Community Center** – Assists with pantry packs, clothing, furniture and appliances.
- **Cass Corridor Youth Advocates** - The Detroit-based agency works across the City in areas of concentrated poverty providing programs for food, health, housing and jobs.
- **Common Ground** – Provides a lifeline for individuals and families in crisis.

- **Crossroads** – A social outreach agency that partners with other agencies to meet immediate emergency needs as well as assess individual situations to lessen the likelihood of future problems. North Church volunteers two Sundays per year, purchasing and preparing the soup kitchen’s meal for several hundred clients.
- **Ecumenical Theological Seminary** – Provides education for ministry that integrates theology with practice and faith with social responsibility.
- **Focus Hope** – Local branch of a nationally recognized civil and human rights organization which provides food and job training in their quest to fight racism, poverty and injustice.
- **Haven** – Provides innovative programs promoting violence-free homes and communities through treatment and prevention services.
- **Lighthouse of Oakland County** - Lighthouse is the single largest nonprofit provider of emergency food and housing to low-income families in Oakland County.
- **Meals for Shut-ins, Detroit** – Operating from First Congregational Church in Detroit, this program delivers lunch to the elderly and handicapped.
- **Michigan Roundtable for Diversity & Inclusion** – Strives to build relationships that create social justice and build sustainable inclusive communities. Addresses inequity throughout our region through a process of recognition, reconciliation and renewal.
- **Salvation Army** - Its mission is to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ and to meet human needs in His name without discrimination.
- **Samaritan Counseling Center** – Operating out of North Church, and several other locations, provides professional therapeutic counseling and educational services to anyone seeking emotional and spiritual wholeness.
- **South Oakland Shelter** - Works with a diverse range of people struggling with homelessness, including first-time homeless individuals and families, the chronically homeless, veterans, domestic violence victims, and people battling substance abuse, mental health issues, and frequently both.

- **NACCC One Great Hour of Sharing**, an ecumenical effort to provide for emergency needs of people struck by disasters – floods, earthquakes, hurricanes, fires, and terrorism.

Starr’s philosophy is rooted in seeing something good in every child. Starr offers a full spectrum of early intervention and prevention services along with specialized residential programs. Starr centers in Michigan are located in Albion, Battle Creek and Detroit.

- **Casa Colibri** - Committed to helping the Mayan people of northwest Guatemala improve their lives through programs in health, education, and related infrastructure.
- **Days for Girls** - Dedicated to creating a more free, dignified, and educated world, through providing lasting access to feminine hygiene solutions and health education.
- **Habitat for Humanity International** – A “Christian housing ministry”, Habitat provides economically-built and funded housing so that everyone has a

decent place to live. Habitat homeowners gain self-respect as they work alongside volunteers to construct their homes.

- **Indian Trails Missions** - Provides spiritual and practical ministry to Native American Indians in the American southwest and Mexico. The mission of Indian Trails is to share God's redemptive love and compassion with the Indian people.

All are lead by natives to the area, giving them an advantage in knowing the language and culture, saving money in specialized training and travel. Native missionaries work side-by-side with the people, giving them the skills and tools for self-sufficiency.
