February brings slightly longer days, and I know we all welcome the return of the light...and the rollout of vaccinations that eventually will allow us to meet in person. Our Reopening Task Team is monitoring all the relevant statistics to be sure we are safe.

Also in February is our annual **Blanket Sunday on February 14** – a collection for **Church World Service's Blanket and Tools of Hope program** that assists people in need around the world. You'll find an article with details on the program and how you can donate; on our website, we'll have a link so that you can contribute online and have that contribution registered as coming via North Church. For those who don't have internet access, you can mail your donation, marked "Blanket Sunday" to the church and we will take it from there. Know that you are helping so many people in so many ways when you do this!

February 17<sup>th</sup> is Ash Wednesday and the start of LENT 2021. Our theme is "The Upside-down Kingdom" as we remember and celebrate that Jesus came to proclaim that the Kingdom of God is at hand. He demonstrated in word and deed a Kingdom unlike any other, one that puts the last first, as described in the Beatitudes (Luke 6:20-31). Allegiance to this kingdom is demonstrated by how one lifts up the last and least, the helpless and the hopeless, by doing for others as you would have them do for you.

Throughout Lent, we'll be thinking about the implications of this Kingdom, and how we can help it to be manifested in the world around us. Although a common custom is to give something up for Lent, we've had to give up so much over the past year in the face of a global pandemic; therefore, this year we'll be thinking about what we add to our lives, what we've learned about the life of faith in this context, what things we'll want to return to and what things we'll want to do in a new way.

Details about our online Lenten services and two parking lot opportunities, to receive ashes on Ash Wednesday, and Palms and more on March 27<sup>th</sup>, are in the Lenten Brochure attached to this newsletter, and on our website. In all these activities, we will be following Jesus' call to repent and believe the Good News. **Repentance is exercising a mindfulness about ourselves and our behavior; it is not self-disgust, but rather, and opening of heart and mind that allows us to walk in the light of God's love.**  I hope you'll take to heart this path of mindfulness and discovery of what we are called to do and be over the seven weeks before Easter, as we continue to be the Body of Christ for the sake of the world, no matter where we are, no matter how we worship.

# Moderator's Notes...

The first month of 2021 is nearly complete. I think we all hoped that with the change of the calendar we could put the sadness and loss and strife of 2020 behind us.

But the new year started with the horrific events of January 6. We looked on as a mob stormed and occupied our Capitol Building, forced Congress into hiding, vandalized our legislature's chambers and offices, injured scores of police, and killed one officer. And as if that were not enough, we have learned of new strains of the coronavirus that are more infectious.

Yet there are signs of hope. The coronavirus vaccine is being administered at an increasing pace. The Covid-19 metrics in Michigan – cases, hospitalizations, deaths – are all improving rapidly. A new Administration took office during a peaceful inauguration day. North Church people continue to help others and make a difference, such as serving at Crossroads last week.

As Christians, we need to remember Jesus' teachings during these trying times. Christ taught us not to hate our enemies but to love them. He taught us to disdain violence as a solution. He taught us to listen to and care for one another. And the message of both the Old and New Testaments echoes our theme for the year – hope will not disappoint us.

Last month I summarized the results of our survey of the Congregation on how we are doing as a 'virtual' Church, and on opinions regarding returning to in-person worship. We are all anxious to return to our building and sanctuary on Sundays and to enjoy the fellowship of being together. I will be monitoring the status of the pandemic in our state and in Oakland County, and reviewing this and other data with our Reopening Task Team, Executive Council, and our Senior Minister. We will all work to strike the right balance between safety and returning to worship in person as soon as possible.

Through all this, the work of the Church continues. Rev. Biedron continues her virtual Sunday worship and Wednesday inspiration series. We continue to support charities such as Crossroads and other benevolences.

#### **Executive Council Notes**

Executive Council met on January 25 and considered the following:

• Assets & Resources: This Board and our Treasurer continue to monitor our Church finances. We finished 2020 with revenues from pledges and other sources down \$36,600 from the prior year, expenses down \$23,200, for a net decline in performance of \$13,400. This was more than offset by our PPP loan of \$43,700. North Church may be eligible for a second PPP loan; A&R, our Treasurer, and our Business Manager are following up.



You will learn more about our finances and the budget for 2021 at our upcoming Business Meeting.

Please complete and submit your pledges for 2021, either via mail-in card or on the Church website. This is vital input into our budgeting for this year.

- **Diaconate:** The Diaconate continues to reach out with cards and phone calls to our shut-in members and friends they are looking for some volunteers to help with this activity (check out the planner and emails from the Church).
- **Education:** Virtual Sunday School continues to go well. The Board is looking at new curriculum materials for Sunday School this year. The Education Board will be preparing craft packets for Lent.
- **Fellowship:** Our Fellowship Board has planned a Church wine and cheese tasting for early February see the Church website. Fellowship is also working with other Boards on another parking lot event for Easter.
- **Missions:** Blanket Sunday is February 14 look to the Church planner and website for more information.
- **Worship:** The Board is looking ahead to Lent. We will still be worshiping remotely, but we are planning parking lot events for Ash Wednesday and Palm Sunday. Again, see the Church planner and website for more information
- New Business:
  - We will have our Annual Business Meeting on **January 31**, wherein the Congregation will be called upon to approve the budget for 2021. Please attend!
  - We will not be hosting SOS this year; Lighthouse is in the process of reviewing the program and its structure (they have been hosting their guests in hotels instead of volunteer churches). We will continue to support Lighthouse and review next year.
  - The 2021 Program Meeting will be **June 27**. It is normally in May, but since it was delayed to September last year this gives the current Board members a bit more time in office.
  - Council approved purchasing a new laptop for our Sr. Minister; with the demands of video recording and Facebook Live for Sunday worship and Wednesday messages, Rev. Biedron found her old machine has reached its limits.
  - I presented the report of the Futures Task Team to Council. This Team started working in October of 2019. There was a pause during much of 2020 due to the pandemic, but the Team reconvened recently and completed its work. The Team made several

recommendations and suggestions aimed at increasing attendance, new visitors, and members. The Team will be working with the Ministry Boards to take the recommendations forward.
