Moderator's Notes...



It is Election Day, happy voting.

My note is a bit late this month. Autumn is well and truly upon us. I spent last week hiking in the Smoky Mountains, enjoying the colors and the crisp fall air.

Last Sunday we observed Halloween at North Church with 'trunk or treat' after worship. The weather cooperated with a sunny day. It was great to see the costumed kids and to socialize with our friends. Thanks to everyone on our Ministry Boards who helped organize the event, and to everyone who brought candy and a 'trunk or treat' automobile.

We wrapped up Missions Month a few weeks ago. Several inspiring speakers joined our Sunday worship to tell us about their organizations. The stories reinforced to me how much need there is in the world and in our own neighborhood – but also how much generosity and good will there is. Thanks to our Missions Ministry Board for organizing this.

We are in the midst of our stewardship drive, this coming weekend will be Commitment Sunday. This is an important event in the life of the Church – your pledges and donations help us plan our budgets and pay for North Church's operation. I hope you will fill out your pledge card and bring it with you Sunday (or drop it off at the Church office). We have had wonderful speakers during our stewardship drive, thanks to our Assets and Resources Ministry Board for their hard work on this.

Looking ahead, **Heritage Sunday will be November 21**. Aside from our normal activities celebrating our heritage, we will have three new confirmands joining our Church membership. Mark your calendars and join us!

Executive Council Notes

Executive Council met on November 1 and considered the following:

- Assets & Resources and Treasurer: Our overall financial performance is better than last year, helped by the forgiveness of our second PPP loan. Year to date through end September revenues are up \$13,000 over last year (though down from 2019), expenses down. The A & R Board approved several building expenses, including repairs related to a roof leak and new air handlers. All of the Boards have developed draft budgets for next year. The A & R Board will compile these and review with Executive Council at the Nov. 22 Council meeting.
- **Diaconate**: The "Pilgrim Postal Pals" program is going well. It is a way to reach out to members / friends who we have not seen in a while, or who may need a friendly word. To participate, pick up one of the addressed envelops in the narthex after worship, sign the enclosed card (with a note if you wish), and drop it in the mail. Diaconate also continues to keep in touch with our shut-ins and to arrange rides for our Fox Run members and friends (if you would like to **volunteer** for Fox Run Sunday driving, please contact **Sandy Greer**). The

Diaconate will be purchasing Advent devotional booklets from the NACCC and distribute to our shut-ins.



- Education: Education is planning an adult education Bible study series in conjunction with our Senior Minister. Sunday School is continuing virtually, via Zoom, with Sunday in-person school and events roughly monthly (like last Sunday's 'trunk or treat'). The Board is looking for a volunteer to help with the Sunday Zoom sessions, see the sign-up sheets in the narthex or contact Michelle Sibley.
- **Fellowship**: Fellowship is planning a 'fowling' social event at the Hawk (you'll need to look it up) and a euchre evening in November, see the Church calendar and contact the Office or **Tim Sirovy** for details. The Fellowship Board is also looking ahead to Advent, making plans for Christmas crafts.
- Missions: Our Missions Board arranged a joint workday at Camp Restore Detroit, teaming with Meadowbrook Congregational Church, on October 2. The team worked outside, on building siding and landscaping. This Board is also looking ahead to the Advent season, making arrangements with Adopt-a-Family to provide the opportunity to assist one or more needy local households at Christmas.
- Worship: The Worship Board is also planning for Thanksgiving and Advent. They are coordinating with Laurie Meeker on music for our holiday worship. Christmas Eve will be a hybrid worship session (in person and live streamed), with the option of lighting candles at home. The Board is making arrangements for Advent candles and for Christmas poinsettias.

• New and Other Business:

- We are waiting for the final equipment to arrive for our new A/V system in the sanctuary (to improve our on-line capabilities). **Rev. Biedron** has interviewed a very promising candidate to work as a contractor on Sundays to run the system during worship.
- We have hired a contractor to help maintain the Church's website. (If you have suggestions for the website, please contact Rev. Biedron or me).
- We are also awaiting equipment for our new, electronic sign on Twelve Mile Road (a replacement for our somewhat decrepit wooden sign).
- Our building is going to need a new roof soon (we are seeing more leaks and roof-related problems). Council discussed a potential capital campaign for this expenditure.
- Council continues to monitor the state of the pandemic in Michigan. Numbers are still
 high, though thankfully seem to have stopped increasing. Council meetings will continue
 via Zoom for the time being.

The pandemic continues to test our patience and resolve; may we continue to live and endure with faith and hope.
