# From the Míníster...

BACK IN PERSON – I'm delighted to announce that with the decline in cases, hospitalizations, and deaths, Executive Council has voted to return to in-person worship (while maintaining live streamed services available on Facebook and YouTube) starting with Ash Wednesday, March 2 at 7 pm.

On Sundays, we'll have hybrid (in person and online) services, 10:30 am. Following worship, coffee and conversation will be available in the Link. Sunday School will also be resuming broadly graded classes in person each week.

BECAUSE WE WILL BE SINGING, PLEASE BRING A MASK! Singing in church is still a super spreader risk, and we want to be able to enjoy singing the hymns and enjoying the music from soloists and the quartet. Choir will not resume until a later date.

LENT – Please see the Lenten Calendar for specific details on Sunday worship services at 10:30, and Wednesday Inspirations at 3:00 p.m. I'll be putting up information on a short-term Lenten Bible study once we get going. Also, starting March 6, I'll introduce a Lenten practice for you: the God Box Project, where we can write our prayers, our concerns, the things that are striking our hearts and put them in a box to offer them to God. See the March 6 sermon for more details!

Looking forward to longer days (Daylight Saving time begins MARCH 13, spring ahead!) and seeing so many of you in person as we move through Lent towards the good news of Easter!

# Moderator's Notes...

Big news! The pandemic numbers – cases, hospitalizations, positive test rate – have all improved dramatically in Michigan. Consequently, Executive Council approved returning to inperson worship starting Ash Wednesday. We ask that attendees space themselves out in the

sanctuary and that you wear masks (singing is a big spreader of droplets and we will of course have hymns during worship). Our services will be hybrid, live on Facebook and YouTube as well as in person, so any with concerns or conflicts can watch remotely. This is a first step, as the pandemic numbers (hopefully) continue to improve we will gradually return to coffee hour, social events, and other activities in our building.




In the other big news, our new electronic sign on Twelve Mile is finally going in. The next time you attend Church you will see the new installation. The sign company is working through issues with the electronics, so stay tuned for activation of the electronic screens.

A big thank you to everyone who helped with Blanket Sunday and who contributed to this worthy cause. As you can see from what's going on in the world, the need for blankets, clothes, and other essentials remains as great as ever.

Our new A/V system is working well (kudos to Emily Eahrow, our video technician). We have added lighting in the sanctuary to improve the quality of the video picture. If you have suggestions or requests for our virtual services, Sunday worship or Wednesday inspiration, please share them with Rev. Biedron, our Worship Ministry Board, or me.

Our capital campaign to raise funds for a new roof continues. We are off to a good start - our goal is \$200,000 and, with contributions, pledges, and the amount already reserved by our Assets & Resources Ministry Board, we stand at over \$144,000. We still need \$56,000 to meet our goal, so please consider donating if you can. You can contribute on our website or by mailing a check to the Church office. You can also arrange to donate on a monthly basis versus all at once – contact our Treasurer, Nancy Scott. Our Assets & Resources Ministry Board has received quotes for the work; the new roof will cost around \$250,000. We hope to raise at least \$200,000 of that though our campaign and cover the remainder from the Church's endowment.



Looking ahead, we will have our annual Program Meeting on May 22 (mark your calendars). At that time we will vote on new officers and Ministry Board members. Executive Council has formed a nominating committee that has begun work. If you would be interested in serving on one of our Ministry Boards you can let any member of Executive Council know, or simply email me at gromk@aol.com (we still have many positions to fill). In addition to the new officers and Board members, I hope that we will be able to ask the Congregation to vote on new by-laws. We have been operating under a suspension of our old by-laws; the updated version will formalize our new organization / Ministry Board structure. If you have suggestions for the bylaws please share them with any Council member.


#### **Executive Council Notes**

Executive Council met on February 28 and considered the following:

- Assets & Resources and Treasurer: No new financial update from our February 6 Business Meeting. As noted above Assets & Resources has received quotes for a new roof; the activity team working on this will review and make a recommendation to the Board. Our stewardship drive has reached about 83% of our target pledge donations for next year (please send in your pledge if you have not already done so).
- **Diaconate:** The Diaconate continues to stay in touch with our shut-ins via calls and cards. Plans are in place for mailing Lent / Easter cards.
- Education: As we return to in-person worship the Education Ministry Board is making plans to also return to in-person Sunday School. New curriculum materials have arrived for 7-12<sup>th</sup> grade. The Education Board plans a Lenten Bible study series with our Senior Minister.
- Fellowship: The Board is planning a chili cookoff / tailgate for March 27.
- **Missions:** Again, kudos for all the work on Church World Service Blanket Sunday. The Missions Ministry Board has been in touch with Camp Restore Detroit to plan a spring mission activity, likely involving outdoor planting and gardening.
- Worship: The Worship Board has coordinated with Rev. Biedron on plans for Lent and Easter. We will do the imposition of ashes in the parking lot for Ash Wednesday, March 2, as well as at the evening service that day. The Board is working with Laurie Meeker on music for Easter. The Board approved the purchase of special singer N95 masks. Ushers, please make note of the return to in-person worship and your team schedule.

#### • Committees

- The nominating committee is formed and has begun work. Thus far we have nominees for 10 out of 25 open positions.
- The communications committee mailed out 769 welcome post cards to households that have moved to our area within the last few months; the cards encourage them to join us for Lent and Easter.



### • New and Other Business:

- Council provided comments and suggestions for the draft Church by-laws and policy manual.
- Council approved May 22 for our Annual Program Meeting.

We look forward to spring, to worshiping together again in the warmth of the spring sun and of God's love.

**BOOK GROUP- Wednesday, March 16<sup>th</sup> -** in person in the Church Conference Room, and on Zoom at 1:00 p.m.

Our book this month is <u>Cloud Cuckoo Land</u> by Anthony Doerr. In 15th century Constantinople, a young girl scales the high walls of an abandoned monastery said to be haunted by spirits who carry their chamberlain through the broken halls on a throne made of bones.

In the 1940s, in Lakeport, Idaho, a boy follows his father to a new job, a new life and, eventually, a new war.

In 2020, a troubled teenager sits in his car outside the Lakeport public library, a gun in his pocket, a bomb in the backpack beside him.

In 2146, mission year 65 of the Argos — a generation ship headed for a new home on Beta Oph2 — a girl arranges scraps of paper on the floor inside a sealed room. She has been inside for 300-some days, her only company an artificial intelligence called Sybil who contains the sum total of all mankind's knowledge.

Doerr's dazzling imagination transports us to worlds so dramatic and immersive that we forget, for a time, our own. He has created a tapestry of times and places that reflects our vast interconnectedness—with other species, with each other, with those who lived before us, and those who will be here after we're gone. Last year we raised over \$54,000, with \$13,000 going to the local agencies.
